On the evening of November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2000, I was informed of the foregoing information by,





The search/processing of the EVANS' residence concluded at approximately 2015 hours at which time,

Travis Hunt

a tenant of the residence was contacted via telephone. A short time later, T. HUNT arrived at the residence during which time it was relinquished into his custody and a copy of the search warrant and a detailed property receipt listing articles seized as evidence in accordance with the search warrant was left within his possession. See a copy of the New Hampshire State Police Property Receipt incorporated and made part of this report.

Further information was developed as a result of the investigation and details of the autopsy which reflected certain pattern injuries sustained to BORTNER. Investigators prepared a supplement search warrant for the EVANS residence in an attempt to locate implements that may have caused the injuries to BORTNER. On Thursday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2000 at approximately 2100 hours a supplement search of the EVANS' residence was commenced with the following New Hampshire State Police Major Crime Personnel.

OVERVIEW

On Friday, November 10, 2000, I met with:

who assigned me to do a narrative overview of a crime scene located at:

191 Milton Rd  
Rochester, New Hampshire

The environmental conditions at the time were cool, cloudy, with intervals of rain.

EXTERNAL


The home was a brown colored, wooden, two story, single-family structure with a paved driveway. Exterior doors were noted on the west, south and east sides of the structure. An unattached garage was located south of the home. In the area of the garage was a fenced in area with a canine within it. A small unattached out building was noted east of the home. Three motor vehicles were noted in the driveway.

Entry into the home was by way of an exterior wood door on the south side. The door opened inward from left to right. The door leads to a kitchen area.

KITCHEN

Entry into the kitchen was by way of an exterior door on the south side of the home. The flooring displayed white tile. A small blue carpet was on the floor in front of this door. The room displayed white walls, with a white textured ceiling.

Observing the kitchen in a clockwise direction from the doorway, a security keypad was noted on the south wall, right of the doorway. Continuing right was an electric light switch. A baseboard heater was noted at the base of the south wall, traveling to the west wall. Continuing right was a window adorned with blue curtains. This window was closed and locked. In front of the window was a round glass dining table. Four metal chairs surrounded the table. The chairs on the north side of same displayed coats. Atop of the table were children's clothing, a diaper bag (WFM-30), papers, a bag of children's clothing, a glass platter containing bananas, a glass bowl containing three pears. On the floor in the area of the table was a bag of "Meaty Bone" dog food.

Continuing right, on the west wall were decorative items. A metal baseboard heater ran along the base of the wall. An electrical outlet is located just above same. Continuing right was an open doorway. An electric light switch was on the wall left of the doorway. This doorway leads to a hallway.


Continuing right, on the north wall was a closed door. This door leads to the basement. To the right was another door. This door opened to a small closet containing various food and household items. Continuing right was a white wall telephone. This telephone was not connected to a telephone jack. Continuing right was a wall thermostat. The thermostat displayed a temperature of sixty-eight degrees.

Continuing right, on the north wall was a white "Armana" refrigerator/freezer. The refrigerator/ freezer contained various food items. The doors of the refrigerator displayed decorative items. Atop the refrigerator were food items. On the floor, left of the refrigerator was a blue trash container. The trash container was lined with a plastic trash bag, containing trash. On the floor in the area of the trash container was a pet food bowl containing a clear liquid.

Continuing right was an open doorway leading to a dining room. Right of the doorway on the floor was a cardboard box containing various soft drinks. Continuing right on the east wall was a "May Tag" stove. Atop the stove were nutritional supplements and condiments. Behind the stove hanging from the wall were various kitchen implements. Above the stove was a white cabinet containing dishware. Continuing right along the east wall was a blue colored counter. Beneath the counter was a "Kenmore" dishwasher. Atop the dishwasher were various cooking utensils.

Continuing right was a pizza box containing pizza. To the back of the counter was a Polaroid photograph displaying a child in a car seat. Continuing right was a metal double bowl sink containing soiled dishes. Behind the sink were two windows. Both windows were closed and locked. The windowsill displayed various decorative items. Right of the sink was an "Oyster" blender. In front of the blender was a portion of a child's "highchair." Draped across the high chair was an empty bag of "Thomas's Bagels." Continuing right were various decorative and food items. Right was a butcher block. The butcher block was missing three knives from same. Above the counter were cabinets.

Continuing right along the south wall, the counter continued. Atop the counter was a "Kenmore" microwave oven. In front of the microwave was a blue plastic bag containing candy. Above the counter attached to the walls were cabinets. The cabinets contained various food items and dishware. The kitchen was otherwise unremarkable.

**HALLWAY**

Entry into the hall was by way of an entrance from the kitchen on the west wall. The walls of the hall were white, with a white textured ceiling. A light fixture was noted within the hall ceiling. The floor was hardwood.

Clockwise from the doorway, a photograph was noted on the south wall. Continuing right is a doorway leading to a bathroom. Right of the door, on the floor was a plastic bag containing clothing, tools, and other unremarkable items.

Continuing right within the west wall was a wooden exterior door, leading to the front yard. The door was closed and locked. A red stepladder was leaning against the door. In front of the ladder were cassette tape shelves containing tapes. Atop the cassette tape shelf was a plastic bag containing toys. Atop the plastic bag was an unopened package containing a "two (2) way radio set." Continuing right against the west wall was an open bag containing "Purina" dog food. On the wall above the dog food was an electric light switch in the off position.



Continuing right facing north was an open doorway leading to a living room area. Continuing right on, the east wall was a photograph. On the floor beneath the photograph was a mop bucket containing a floor mop and a dark colored liquid. This room was otherwise unremarkable.

**BATHROOM**

Entry to the bathroom was made by way of a doorway on the south side of the hall. The door opens in from left to right. The bathroom walls were blue, with gray tile covering the lower portion of the walls. The floor was covered with patterned linoleum. The ceiling was a white textured ceiling. Clockwise from the doorway, on the north wall was a light switch in the off position.

Continuing right along the east wall was a blue counter top. Within the counter was a blue sink. Atop the counter top were magazines, newspapers, and toiletry items. The cabinet contained various medicines, health aids, toiletry, and cleaning items. On the wall above the sink was a medicine cabinet. The medicine cabinet contained medicines, vitamins and toiletry items. On either side of the medicine cabinet is a light fixture.

Continuing right within the south wall was a window. The window was closed, and not locked. Blue blinds adorned the window. The blinds were open. Right of the window were three small towel holders. On the floor beneath the towel holders was a magazine. Along the base of the south wall was a baseboard heater. On the floor in front of the heater was a "kitty litter box" constructed from a shoebox. Continuing right in the southwest corner of the room was a wicker basket containing various magazines.

Continuing right along the west wall was a blue toilet. The toilet seat was up. Atop the toilet tank was an air freshener. Right of the toilet was a plunger. On the wall above the toilet was a small cabinet, with mirrored doors. The cabinet contained various medications and health products. Atop the cabinet was a bottle of "nail polish remover."

Continuing right along the north wall was a blue plastic trash container. The trash container contained opened mail. Above the trash container on the north wall was a toilet paper dispenser. Continuing right was the bathroom doorway. The bathroom was otherwise unremarkable.



**LIVING ROOM**

Entry into the living room was made by way of a doorway on the north side of the hallway. The walls of the living room were white, with a white textured ceiling. Hardwood covered the floor. Clockwise from the doorway, on the west wall were two shelves containing numerous compact discs. Along the base of the west wall was a white baseboard heater. Continuing right in front of the baseboard was a white chest containing videotapes. Atop the chest were magazines. On the wall above, the chest was a light fixture that was off.

Continuing right was a cardboard box of clothing. Continuing right was another cardboard box displaying the picture of a "colored 17" monitor." Atop of this cardboard box was an open cardboard box displaying a "HP DeskJet 84 mc" printer. A plastic bag was next to the printer box containing computer supplies. Behind the monitor box was a red plastic children's baseball bat (WFM-29). Right of the monitor box was an electrical wall outlet. Continuing right within the west wall were three windows, adorned with white curtains. A small clock was noted atop the windowsill.

Continuing right along the west wall was a glass top end table. Atop the end table were a black cordless telephone receiver and an open box of "Kleenex". Continuing right was a two seat tan sofa, with two pillows and a comforter draped over the back. Continuing right was a glass end table, with decorative candles atop of it. On the wall behind the end table was a picture. Between the sofa and end table was a bag containing children toys.

Continuing right on the north wall was a small window adorned with blue blinds. This window was closed, but not locked. Continuing right was a fireplace with a wooden mantle. Atop the mantle were photographs and decorative items. Above the fireplace on the wall on each side of the mantle were two light fixtures. Centered on the wall above the mantle was a picture. Right of the fireplace was a window. This window was closed, unlocked, and adorned similar to the previously mentioned window.



### DINING ROOM

Continuing right on the south wall were photographs. An electrical outlet was noted on the wall beneath the photographs. Continuing right was an electric light switch in the off position. Right of the light switch was the kitchen doorway. Above the doorway on the wall was a decorative item. Right of the doorway was a mirror. On the floor beneath the mirror were four bottles of water.

Affixed to the west wall behind the desk were various pieces of paper containing writing on same (names, to do lists). A light fixture was noted on the west wall. Above the light fixture was a photograph of three people. The contents of the desk displayed office supplies, mail, sewing supplies, cassette tapes, greeting cards and photographs.







Atop the clothing baskets was a wicker basket containing clothing. On the floor in the area of the basket were cardboard boxes. A plastic bag containing office supplies was atop the boxes.

Continuing right in the northwest corner of the room were four bins containing various articles of clothing. Above the bins on the north wall was a "New England Patriots" clock. Continuing right was a closet. The closet contained male and female clothing. On the floor in front of the closet was exercise equipment. Continuing right was a plastic container of health products.
