in my cruiser, in the parking lot of Old Navy in Kittery, Maine, where Aguilar was employed part-time. He is enlisted in the United States Navy full-time.

A few days before Kassidy Bortner died, Aguilar said he and Amanda were folding clothes after Old Navy had closed. [REDACTED], twenty-something boyfriend. She [REDACTED] was more than [REDACTED]. She took care of the kids. They lived together.

Aguilar said Amanda had problems with Cassidy before and she had to leave work. I asked if this was before or after she moved in with Chad. Aguilar said it was when Amanda lived with Chad.

Amanda told Aguilar, Cassidy's father wasn't in the picture. Amanda had a problem with Old Navy when she had to leave. Aguilar couldn't remember if Cassidy had pneumonia or an injury but Amanda got a call and had to leave. Aguilar thinks it may have been pneumonia but he wasn't sure.

Aguilar said Amanda had it together but she was stressed. Aguilar said he was divorced, relationships were a big topic. He said you pick up on the little things.

Aguilar [REDACTED] knew she shouldn't be with him (Chad). She told him th [REDACTED] pro [REDACTED] kids. He (Chad) had his place and she (Amanda) had hers. [REDACTED] ng c [REDACTED] Things that weren't good to do in front of the kids.

Amanda told Aguilar she was fed up with taking care of the kids. [REDACTED] go [REDACTED]. Aguilar said Amanda definitely had more stuff in her life to deal with than she was ready for.

Aguilar remembered thinking he wished he had more time to talk to Amanda. But just as Amanda began opening up to him, another employee walked by and annoyed Amanda. Amanda stopped talking to Aguilar.

I asked Aguilar if he could remember anything else. He said he remembered something about a wall. Amanda being pushed into the wall or one of the kids being pushed into the wall by Chad. Aguilar said they had an explosive relationship. Aguilar said girls will talk about how they fight back with their boyfriends, but Amanda never did.

I asked Aguilar to explain about the wall. He remembered Amanda telling him they were in the apartment arguing. Not sure if Chad pushed or pinned into the wall. Aguilar wasn't sure if it was Amanda or Cassidy.

at the Kittery Police Department. The purpose of the meeting was to determine the details of a fall KASSIDY had taken from JEFF MARSHALL'S truck, which PEIRCE had observed. PEIRCE related the following. He believes the fall occurred just a day or two before KASSIDY's death. PEIRCE said KASSIDY was in her car seat in MARSHALL'S pickup truck. KASSIDY was getting out of the car seat under her own power, she kind of rolled forward in a falling motion and MARSHALL caught her without her striking the ground. PEIRCE did not believe she struck her head on the truck. He said KASSIDY did not cry and he believes if she had struck her head, they would have noticed. PEIRCE said that MARSHALL commented "See, she just falls out of the truck." which PEIRCE took to mean she had fallen out of the truck before.

PEIRCE told me he had spoken with MARSHALL by telephone, on Wednesday evening before KASSIDY'S death. MARSHALL told him about a telephone call from C. EVANS in which C. EVANS told MARSHALL that KASSIDY had been struck by a baseball and her eyes had gone back in her head. PEIRCE also spoke with MARSHALL by telephone on Thursday morning, at about 0900 hours. MARSHALL told him that KASSIDY was not walking, she was sitting in front of the television eating cereal.

PEIRCE said MARSHALL had shown him bruises on KASSIDY'S face about three to four weeks before her death. PEIRCE described two faded bruises on her cheekbones, below her eyes, and fading grip mark type bruises on her face, on either side of her mouth. PEIRCE said that about one to two weeks before KASSIDY'S death, he noticed the grip mark type bruises had darkened again.


