My answers to your questions are as follows (Please refer to your letter of June 24. Copy enclosed.)

1. There is no contradiction.

Fat emboli could have been an acute phenomenon, or a delayed pathophysiological process.

2. Fingernail clippings should have been taken and examined.

That is a matter that should have been (and still should be) pursued.

3. Impossible to speculate about such a possibility. In any event, that is not a tangible and meaningful avenue for you to pursue or rely upon at this time.

4. I do not believe that new brain wave scan technology is likely to be utilized in your case. It is not a recognized scientific test like DNA. And you will never get the State to order it.
