Congratulations, again, on your inauguration and thank you for your gracious greeting of me and Chad Evans's father, Chet, on that day.

Among other hoped-for accomplishments in your work as Governor, I hope you will enhance the meaning of justice in New Hampshire by putting New Hampshire in the group of the vast majority of U.S. States which are concerned about avoiding and correcting wrongful convictions.

When I learned of your planned "open house," I asked Chad Evans to write a letter to you, which his father and I could bring to you personally. As we didn't have time to discuss the request, Chad wrote two letters and he asked me to choose the best and bring to you. However, the letters arrived here the day after your inauguration.
