On the above date at 2100 I responded along with Trooper Graham and several other officers to effect the arrest of Evans at his home at 191 Milton Rd. On scene I pulled up in my marked cruiser #2 and parked along side the roadway. I was immediately approached by a white German shepherd which growled at me and then went after Trooper Graham. He held the dog at bay and did not move. A male exited the home and walked up to the dog and took custody of the dog, chaining it up outside of the home.

I walked up to the front door and saw another older male, later identified as Evans' father exit the home. I asked him if Chad Evans was home. He advised that he was and inside the home and invited us inside. I walked into the home and made contact with Evans at the bottom of the second story stairway. I advised along with trooper Graham that we had an active warrant for him and hand cuffed him with out any problems. At first it appeared that he was pulling away however I believe that he was only going to say good bye to his parents and another female who were walking behind him.

He said good bye to the other person and he was advised that the warrant was for Manslaughter. He was escorted out of the home by Trooper Graham while I explained to his parents that he would be going to the Rochester Police Station for processing. I advised them that they could come down to the station however it would be a while before he would be finished the processing.

I searched him for weapons prior to transporting him to the station. he was placed in the right rear of my vehicle and seatbelted inside. I checked to see that the seat belt was properly adjusted for the transport and called out to dispatch my vehicle number and starting mileage:

vehicle #2 starting mileage 45891@ 2110

I transported him to the station. During the transport he was not asked any questions but he did make conversation with this officer.

He asked me what the blue cruiser was behind mine while we were parked at the home. I advised him that it was a Maine State Trooper.

He then asked me about Callaghan. I advised him that he was a detective now and not a patrol man. He advised that when he first met Callaghan he was working at McDonalds and reported that some one stole bread buns from the rear of the building and he took the report.

He then asked me what Manslaughter meant. I advised him that I did not have my book in front of me to give him an accurate definition.

He advised that the handcuffs were tightening down on his wrists. I advised him to turn his back to the side and to try and lean forward. He advised that they were dealing better after he did what I said. At the station he was taken out of the cruiser after I reported the ending mileage:

He was brought to a separate interview room as the booking room was filled with 4 intoxicated persons being booked. I completed the arrest sheet and report and finger printed him through the AFIS and major palm prints ink . When they were completed he was released to detectives who took custody of Evans.
