Since my last letter to you on November 4, 2011 there has been a significant development in my case. On Monday, April 30 2012, I was given a polygraph lie detection test and passed with No Deception Indicated (NDI). The test was administered by retired NH State Police Lieutenant, John Healy, the president of his graduating class at the New England Polygraph Institute.

Enclosed is copy of the polygraph report. The test and extensive pretest interview were also video recorded. I believe upon request we can have the charts and video forwarded if you would like to have your experts review the information in detail.

In July 2010 I also passed a Voice Stress Analysis (VSA) lie detection test with No Deception Indicated. I know of no other individual in the United States claiming innocence who has passed two different types of lie detection test with N.D.I.

An interesting aspect of this case; in reviewing the original case investigation plan apparently written by NH State Police Sgt. James White, was the police intended to give polygraph exams to the four adults who had direct contact with Kassidy during her last 48 hours alive. The plan was apparently abandoned after Jeffrey Marshall, who was alone with Kassidy during her last 4 ½ hours, was scheduled and later declined to take an exam.

I understand that as the boyfriend of Kassidy's mother Amanda, I was statistically a logical suspect. However, statistics are far from proof. The evidence in this case was circumstantial at best and often forced. In fact, two world renowned Forensic Pathologists; Dr. Michael Baden and Dr. Cyril Wecht, agree that the fat emboli that likely caused Kassidy's death was the result of a traumatic event that happened two hours or less prior to her death. (As mentioned above, this was a period when Kassidy was in the sole custody of her babysitter, Jeffrey Marshall.) The police employed coercive techniques throughout their interviews with multiple witnesses once their theory of the case was established. Thus, I believe the investigation was results driven. Homicide was immediately thought at the exclusion of all else.

I have never believed in the merits of corporal punishment and NEVER hit or even spanked Kassidy. I have sought these lie detection tests to add credibility to my claim of actual innocence.

I know that the polygraph has figured prominently in some of your past exoneration cases and I am hopeful that you will consider the results here and help me prove my innocence. I have lost nearly twelve years of my life for a crime I didn't commit. I am desperate and need your help.
