Chad Evans was wrongly convicted in 2001 in New Hampshire of murdering Kassidy Bortner, the daughter of his girlfriend.

Briefly, he was a good father to his own son and father figure to Kassidy. It is not certain why Kassidy died, but if her death was caused by a person, it was likely by the male babysitter in whose care she was living during her last five hours of life.
